Questions for Reflection and Discussion

- Ravi Zacharias notes: "Today we have to find the back door into people's hearts—because the front door is heavily guarded." What "guards" have you encountered from those who don't share your faith?
- If you fully embraced the idea that you are God's mailman, how does that change the way you think about your neighborhood, your work place, your family, and friends?
 - Jot down some of the people on your day-to-day route that God has put on your heart.
 - What hinders you from delivering God's mail to these people?
- If another Christian came up to you and asked you how to have a God conversation without being socially inappropriate what would you tell them?
- Read Colossians 4:5. Doug used a football analogy to help us apply this verse.
 What did you take away from his analogy that you could apply with the people on your day-to-day route?
- Doug defined God Space as: "A place where God's love is demonstrated in practical, doable, and authentic ways. Safe space is created for cynics, skeptics, and spiritually curious people to raise their questions, express their doubts, and vent their frustrations. Seeds of faith are cultivated, planted, watered, and nurtured. Christianity becomes credible, relevant, plausible, and believable."

What "a-ha's" did you have as Doug shared his story of how to practically create "God Space"?

90 to 100: Congratulations! Don't be surprised if other Christians frequently misunderstand you. If Jesus was misunderstood for being a "friend of sinners", so will you! Continue to live for an audience of One & some day you will hear "well done, good and faithful servant".

70 to 89: You must decrease, Jesus must increase: one relationship at a time, one conversation at a time, and one heart attitude at a time. If most of your friends are Christians, it's time to step outside your Christian bubble. Join a new club, pursue a hobby, find common ground with those who are outside the faith but within your reach. Resolve today to be in closer proximity to people who are far from God. Don't be surprised if God uses "lost" people to save you from the attitudes in your heart that are not-yet like His. Please note: Do not make this outward journey on your own. Jesus sent his disciples out in two's for a reason. Find an accountability partner!

Under 70: Jesus needs to do something in you before he can do something through you. Read "The Prodigal God" by Tim Keller to gain some fresh perspective. Read "God Space" for some practical, doable, and authentic ideas of how to practically be a "friend of sinners" in your day-to-day world. Begin each day with this prayer: "Lord Jesus, help me to see the people who will cross my path this day the way you do". Then pay attention to the little nudges the Holy Spirit will give you as you walk through your day.
