Sermon Summary

Last week we learned that the church is both unified by our commitment to Christ and in our love and care for one another, but we are diverse in our backgrounds and spiritual giftings. God has purposed that this unified-diverse body of believers represents Jesus in the world. We are to love as He loves, to live as He lived, and serve as He served. We should live differently from the world, because we are different. God has forgiven us, given us spiritual life, adopted us into his family, blessed us with every spiritual blessing, has caused his Spirit to dwell within us and has opened our eyes to a whole new realm of reality. We are to walk in that reality. We are to be in the world but not of the world (Ephesians 4:17). The unsaved people of this world are darkened in their understanding (v. 18-23; cf. 2 Corinthians 4:3-4 and Romans 12:2). How you think will determine how you live and for whom you live. Many of us have a very unbiblical self-portrait. Too often we access our worth based upon worldly standards: our performance and appearance, relative to others, and our perception of how others may think about us.

We must reject worldly standards, dwelling instead on who God says we believers are: [1] saints (1:1); [2] blessed (1:3); [3] adopted (1:5); [4] forgiven (1:7); [5] heirs (1:11); [6] saved, [7] secure (1:13); [8] enthroned with Christ (2:6); [9] created for good works (2:10) and [10] having confident access to God (2:18 & 3:12). None of this is true of the unsaved person. Even though they are created in God's image, their list looks quite different. Non-believers are [1] spiritually dead in their trespasses and sins (2:1 & 4:17); [2] "sons of disobedience" who follow after the course of this fallen world, indulging the desires of their flesh and mind (2:2-3). They are [3] alienated from God and under his wrath (2:4, 12), being [4] excluded from God's people (2:12) and [5] without hope, [6] God or [7] his promises (2:12). Their [8] understanding is darkened and ignorant; their [9] hearts are hard and [10] enslaved to sensuality (4:17, 19). This described all of us prior to coming to faith in Christ. And how do non-believers live? Callously, sensually, impurely and greedily (4:19).

But believers are taught to lay aside that "old man", to stop living the way we once lived, because that old person is dead! When Jesus rose from the grave, it gave birth to the "new man" in us. Our walk must match our new identity in six practical ways: [1] Tell the truth, not lies (v. 25), because we are "members" of a living organism, the church. When we lie to one another, it breeds mistrust and hinders our mission in the world. [2] Ensure that our anger is righteous (v. 26–27). Deal with today's issues today. Don't allow them to spill over as unresolved conflict which gives the devil an opportunity to wreak relational havoc. [3] Don't steal; instead work and give to others (v. 28). We work not only to provide for our needs and the needs of our families, but also so that we can help other believers (2 Thessalonians 3:7-11). [4] Build others up with your speech (v. 29-30). Attack problems, not people (Proverbs 25:11). [5] Be kind, tenderhearted, forgiving, not angry and bitter (v. 31-32). [6] No immorality or coarse jesting, but rather gratitude for pure sexuality (5:3-4). Pornography, prostitution, the human sex trade, incest, rape, homosexuality, promiscuity and sexually transmitted diseases, and abortion. The pain and suffering is nearly incalculable! The unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God; he will judge fornicators and adulterers (1 Corinthians 6:9–11 & Hebrews 13:4). Believers are to imitate God, to walk in love. When we do, our lives are a fragrant aroma to our God (5:1-2) and an acceptable act of spiritual worship and service to God (Romans 12:1).
